We in New York Kolping are hosting the 2026 biennial National Kolping Convention in September of next year. There are all sorts of volunteer roles we will be looking to fill. The Convention is a two-day meeting of representatives from each of the U.S. Kolping Societies. Approximately 25-30 delegates and officers meet to review progress and determine the future course for our Society. Dozens of friends and family members join in and travel to the host city. KOLPING AND VOCATIONS -KOVA

Catholic Kolping Society New York has a project directed to supporting young people who would like to explore a trade. College is only one path and it is sometimes difficult to know where to begin to explore other options. Father Kolping worked as a shoemaker before becoming a priest and he thoroughly understood the challenges and satisfactions of being a craftsman. When he opened his first Kolping House it was to support young people as they moved away from their childhood homes to work in trades and become independent. Funded by a generous legacy gift, the Kolping Occupational and Vocational Apostolate project contributes to defray the employer's cost of training a young person who is endeavoring to enter a particular vocational training and learn new skills. A KOVA grant is a one-time payment to help encourage an employer to take the extra time and energy of investing in training the next generation. Applications are considered on a rolling basis. LENTEN PROJECT 2025

We will again support the Kolping Families in Kenya

Our National Kolping Society is continuing support of Kolping brothers and sisters in Kenya. Do you want to make a difference in the world? Can you find \$1 to share with a Kolping brother or sister? Kolping's Lenten Project this year is again designed to help some of our Kolping brothers and sisters rise from poverty to self-sufficiency. We've partnered successfully the past few years by providing them with goats and the training to care for the animals and use them to help feed their family and provide a small income. This year we will focus on the water shortage there. We will help provide water collection tanks that sit on the roofs of homes to collect rain water. Additionally we'll help to purchase multi-story container gardens which use water more efficiently. The water tanks cost about \$335. Perhaps you are in a position to underwrite one of these tanks. The container garden sets cost about \$20.50. That's an amount most of us can find in our budgets.

Can you help by contributing to the Lenten Project? If each of us in NY Kolping gives \$1, for each day of Lent, or \$40 each, that would empower dozens of families to be more self-sufficient! Kolping International is coordinating this project with Kolping in Kenya.

ADOLPH KOLPING — Thought leader and visionary

Adolph Kolping was born more than 200 years ago. His ideas were modern at the time and they are still relevant today. The misery and the social consequences of the early stages of industrialization were reasons for Kolping to take initiative and to devote his life to the people living on the margins of society.

How would you apply this to today's world and how could young people in 2025 follow in Father Kolping's footsteps?

Scholarship Applicants must:

- 1. Be a member or the child or grandchild of a member of the Catholic Kolping Society of New York.
- 2. Provide proof of enrollment in college or post-high vocational program.
- 3. Submit an essay of no more than 1,000 words. Please follow the standards and format of the New York State English Regents essay. Remember that correct use of grammar and vocabulary will be taken into account.
- 4. Please double space all lines in your essay.
- 5. Submit essay on a separate page (separate pdf if emailing) WITH NO reference to name family, or anything by which the judges would be able to identify you.
- 6. Not be a previous winner or applicant.
- 7. Accept the decision of the judges as final.
- 8. Send application, proof of enrollment, and essay by midnight SUNDAY, APRIL 13, 2025. Please email materials electronically to kolpingny@gmail.com or U.S. mail to Joan Dengler, 7 Ganung Dr, Ossining, NY 10562.
