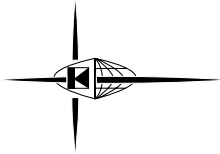

At first glance you might be thinking this article is about one of the eagles that fly over the towering evergreens at the Kolping; however, this story is about our son Michael Cudahy achieving the rank of Eagle Scout. It is Boy Scout's highest and most distinguished rank and since 1912 only 2 percent of eligible scouts have earned this honor.

Michael had joined Cub Scouts way back in 2006 when he was seven, but it was not until he was entering Middle School when he was faced with a huge decision. All of his friends that had been with him in Cub Scouts decided not to continue on with Boy Scouts. Sports and other activities became more popular and let's face it, being a "Boy Scout" was not a cool thing to be. We are proud that Michael decided to join Boy Scout Troop 36 and never looked back.

To achieve the rank of Eagle Scout you must earn 21 merit badges, assume leadership roles in your troop and complete a major service project. Michael's project was clearing a 300 foot path from the Kolping's main buildings down to a beach which he also cleaned and beautified. With leadership, guidance, and hard work he was able to organize and motivate his team of scouts and adults to forge a beautiful path to the majestic Hudson River.

As with life, the path which Michael cleared was comprised of numerous twists and turns, obstacles large and small and various setbacks that were beyond his control. It would have been very easy to become discouraged, but Michael forged ahead and completed his goal.

We are honored that Michael achieved the rank of Eagle Scout and know that the skills he has learned in Scouting will continue to assist him throughout his life. His dedication, determination and growth continue to impress us and we look forward to the future challenges he decides to tackle.

LEONARDO DICAPRIO: Oscar Winner with German Roots

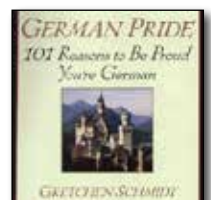

The 2016 Motion Picture Academy awards (the iconic Oscars) glistened in the hands of the winners. Although lacking the polish of longtime Master of Ceremonies, Bob Hope, imparted to these events, the ceremony was an example of good showmanship.

The best actor award went to Leonardo DiCaprio for his portrayal of Hugh Glass in *The Revenant*, inspired by true events. In 1823, Glass joined a fur-trapping expedition into what today is South Dakota. An encounter with a grizzly bear left Glass seriously mauled and he was then betrayed by two fellow trappers who left him to die. Yet Glass mustered the strength to crawl across the primitive terrain and was saved by Indians. After months of tribal medical care, Glass set out to settle accounts with his betrayers—with a surprise ending.

Before winning his first Oscar in February, DiCaprio had a 15 minute audience with his Holiness Pope Francis on January 20, 2016 where the two discussed concern over the environment. At the cordial meeting, the Pope gave him a rosary and 2 missals; DiCaprio reportedly gave the pontiff a check from his charitable foundation with the advice to spend it as his heart directs. Did you know DiCaprio's mother, Irmelin Indenbirken, was born in Germany? His father is of half Italian and half German heritage. His middle name is Wilhelm, in honor of his Opa who was a miner in Germany's coal and steel Ruhr valley. Leonardo spent many summers in the small town of Oer-Erkenschwick, in North Rhine-Westphalia, where his grandmother lives (she attended the London premiere of *Titanic*. 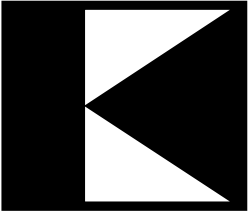
