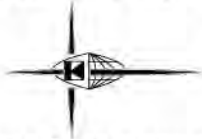

Stories of Interest

Honus Wagner submitted by Martin A. Kelly

Honus Wagner is probably better known for his baseball card, which is more valuable than anybody else's because of its rarity. But his career was better than any other shortstop in big-league history, too.

Johannes Peter "Honus" Wagner was born to German immigrants Peter and Katheryn Wagner in the Chartiers neighborhood of Pittsburgh, which is now a part of the borough of Carnegie, Pennsylvania. Wagner was one of nine children. As a child, he was called Hans by his mother, which later evolved into Honus. "Hans" was also an alternate nickname during his major league career. Wagner was also nicknamed "The Flying Dutchman" due to his superb speed and German heritage. Wagner dropped out of school at age twelve to help his father and brothers in the coal mines; but, his heart was in the ball stadium. Eventually, scouts signed him up with the Pittsburgh Pirates where he started his major league career as shortstop for 17 years (1899-1917).

When he retired, he had broken every record on the books: his lifetime batting average was .329; he stole a total of 722 bases; and his fielding record won him recognition as "the finest shortstop in major league history." Wagner retired with more hits, runs, RBI, doubles, triples, games and steals than any other National League player.

In addition, he was always genteel on and off the field, in an era where rowdiness was the mode.

It was fitting that he was among the first five baseball players to be admitted to the Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY when it opened in 1936. He died in 1955 when most of his records in hits and games played stood. A true credit to his German-American heritage.

Wagner's image is perhaps best recognized by most people today on account of his famously rare baseball card. The first baseball cards were actually sold not with chewing gum, but tobacco. Although Wagner chewed tobacco himself, he did not want children to buy cigarettes to get his card, so he requested the American Tobacco Company to cease using his image. The company complied, after about 200 were sold to the public (57 are known to exist today) making his card the rarest of the collection. In fact, one mint-condition Honus Wagner card sold in 2007 for \$2.8 million.
