56th Annual Steuben Day Parade Saturday, September 21, 2013

Americans of German language background all over the country are getting ready for the 56th Steuben Parade. In addition to the many groups from the tri-state area, organizers are expecting twenty music, dance and karneval groups from Germany, Austria and Switzerland, plus German-American groups from Wisconsin, Minnesota and Florida.

Three Grand Marshals will lead this year's parade: US Soccer legend Werner Roth, German brewery magnate Christian Dinkelacker, and Harald Leibrecht, coordinator for transatlantic affairs in the German parliament.

Join us and march down 5th Avenue with the Kolping Society! You do not have to be of German heritage to march. The parade route will go from 68th to 86th Street. We will line up on 70th St. between Madison and Park Avenues. You must be there by 11:45am.

The Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral will begin at 9:00am (arrive in front of the church at 8:30am). We encourage all marchers to follow a "dress code"—trocken, or orange and black, for the Kolping colors, or blue bottoms and white tops—or suits for men.

Please join us for our annual "Steuben Parade Celebration" after-party at Kolping House at 165 East 88th Street. Eat, drink and have a great time. 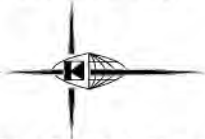

And most of all, thank you to all of you who attended—YOU made the night a success.



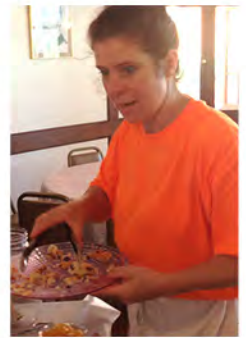
Champagne Brunch

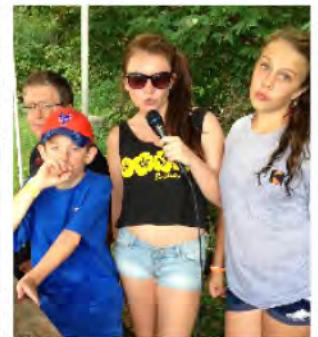
