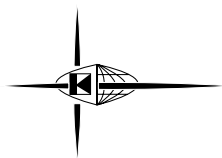

Arnold to Terminate Hate

The Simon Wiesenthal Center commends Arnold Schwarzenegger for his generous gift to support the Center's work fighting hate, bigotry and anti-Semitism.

Action star and ex-politician Arnold Schwarzenegger is a real-life hero! In response to the violent protesters who terrorized Charlottesville, Va., the "Total Recall" actor is donating \$100,000 to the Simon Wiesenthal Center. The anti-hate organization, named for Holocaust survivor and Nazi hunter Wiesenthal, is an international human rights charity dedicated to "repairing the world."

"My heart and feelings are with the citizens of Charlottesville. My message to them is simple: you will not win. Our voices are louder and stronger. There is no white America—there is only the United States of America. You were not born with these hateful views—you can change, grow, and evolve, and I suggest you start immediately. Today, I'm sending \$100,000 to an anti-hate organization I've worked with for decades— the Simon Wiesenthal Center, named after the great Nazi hunter who I was lucky to call a friend."
