

This is totally not true - and she added "we give aid to ALL because we ARE Catholics".

We learned that the biggest need in the United States is hunger, followed by a lack of affordable housing. Supporting food pantries is the Brooklyn Kolping Family's primary outreach, and providing affordable housing at the NY Kolping House and Kolping on the Concourse is NY Kolping's...so I would say we are on target!

Thanks to Katrina Dengler, Vice President of New York Kolping, who let me know about the event and suggested we attend together.
